

# 3-D BUNNY PAPER CHAINS

These super-duper cute paper chains can be cut from scrap paper or simply printer paper, making this a great frugal Easter decoration for you! Make them small or make them big—either way, they are just too cute not to have a go at.

## MATERIALS

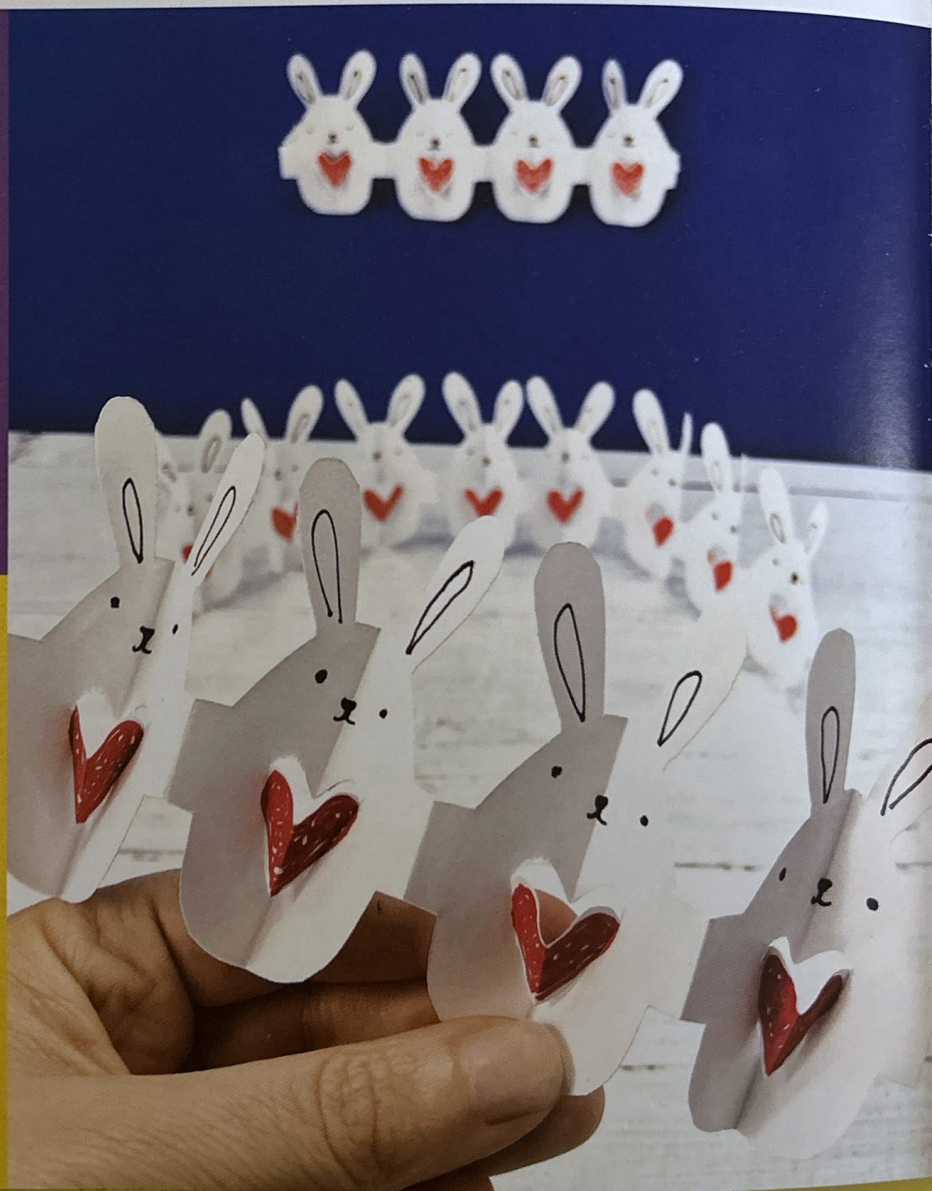
- White paper

## TOOLS

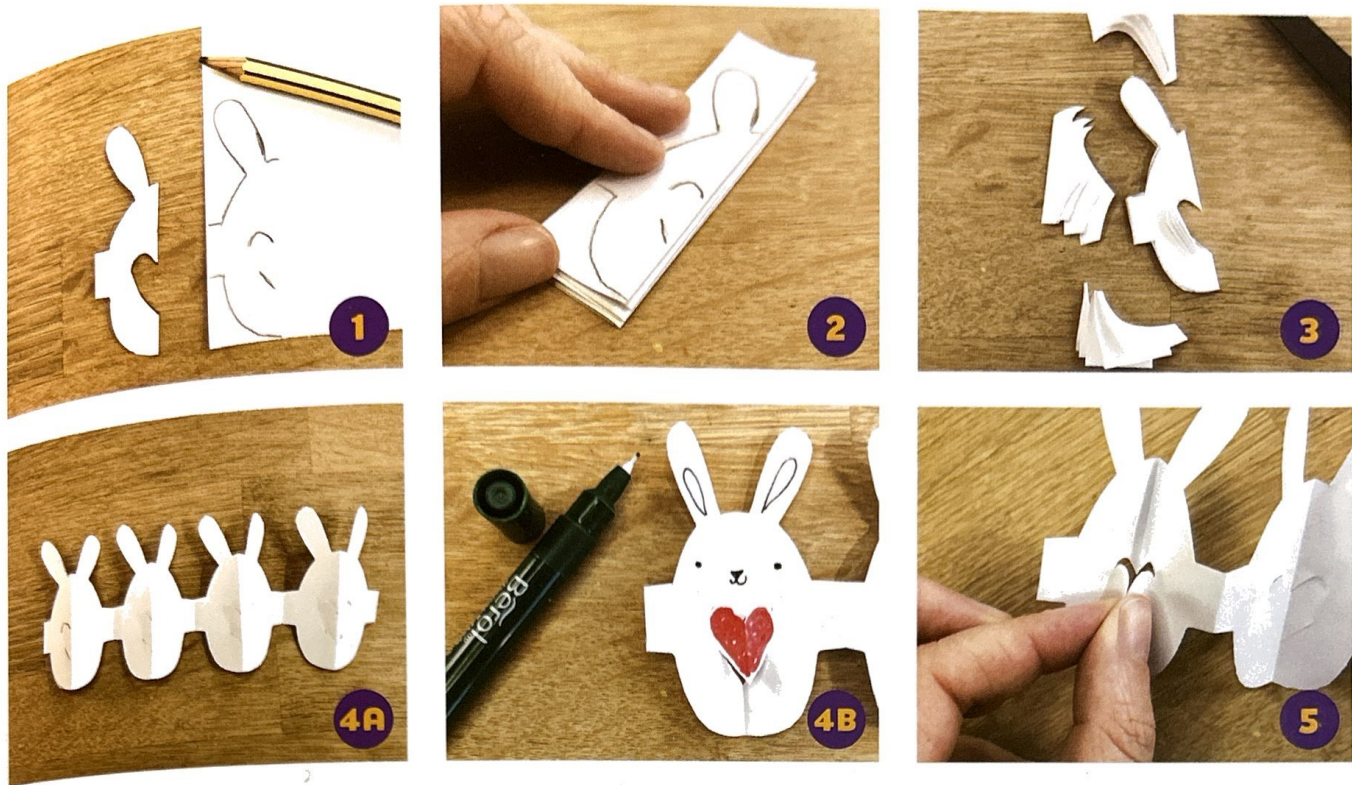
- Lead pencil
- Scissors
- Pens (optional)
- Glue stick (optional, for larger paper chains)

## TOP TIP

We find cutting up to 4 bunnies per strip manageable. If you start cutting more, the paper gets very stiff and it is much harder to cut. Alternatively, make your bunnies bigger or use thinner newspaper as your paper, to cut out more in one go!







- 1.** Using a lead pencil, trace the bunny template at the back of this book (page 181). Or design your own! Make sure that any design is symmetrical and that you can fold your design in half, then cut out. Copy the design to the edge of your paper strip.
- 2.** Fold along the central line of each bunny and accordion-fold your paper. Make your folds as neatly as possible—the neater and more aligned they are, the cuter your final bunny paper chain will be.
- 3.** Cut out your bunny outline. Note that you must not cut through *all* of the heart, as you want it to stay connected. If you do cut out the heart fully, you will still have an adorable paper chain, but just with a heart-shaped hole in the middle!
- 4.** Unfold and add any details in pen that you wish to add, such as coloring the heart in a desired color and adding bunny facial features.
- 5.** Reverse the heart fold by squeezing it into the opposite direction. This will make your bunny heart pop out.
- 6.** Repeat as many times as you wish and glue your individual bunny chains together.
