5 and 5 make 10 – So glad we're here again!



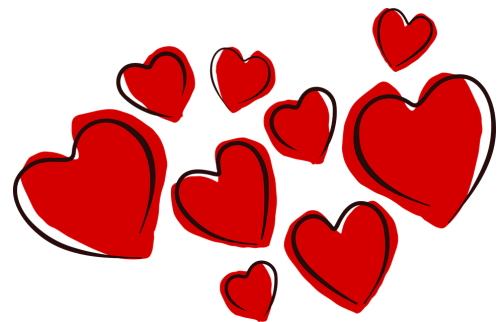
Opening Rhyme: Hello Friends

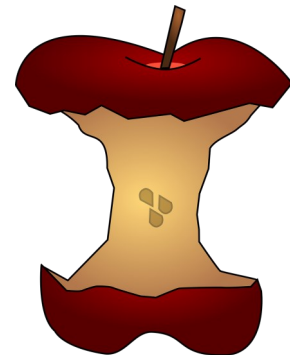
Eat an Apple

And grow some more!



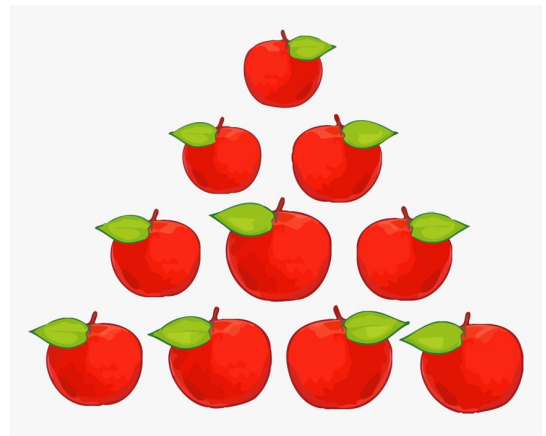
Ten Ripe Apples

There were five for you, and there were five for me.

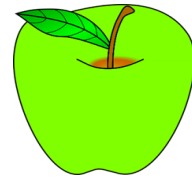
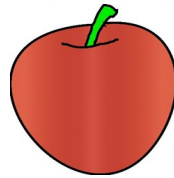
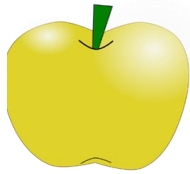
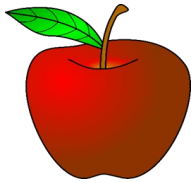
When we shake the trees just so –

Raccoon, Possum, and Rabbit – Song by Dan Zanes & Elizabeth Mitchell

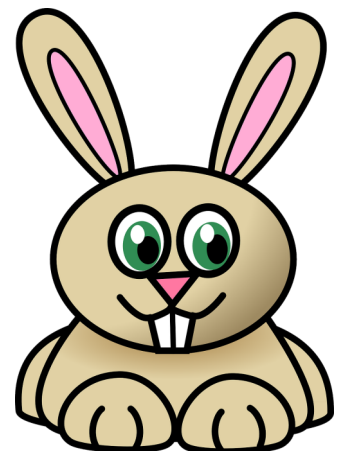
Raccoon's got a bushy tail, Possum's tail goes bare
