5 and 5 make 10 – So glad we're here again!



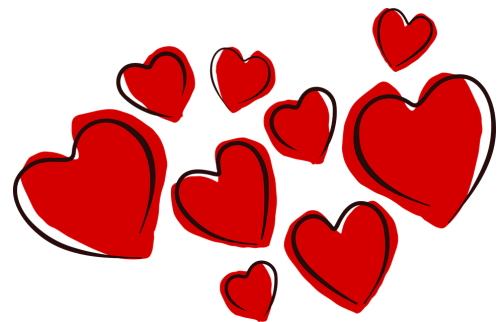
Opening Rhyme: Hello Friends

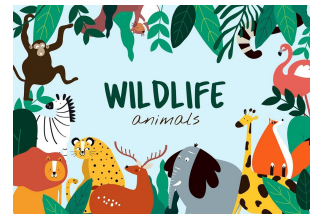

One ... Auntie called ...

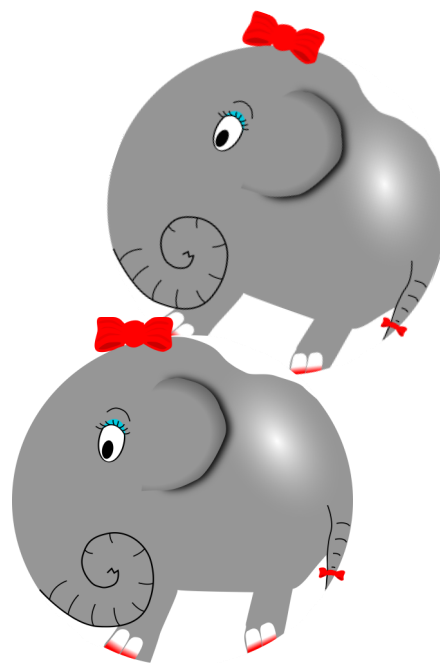


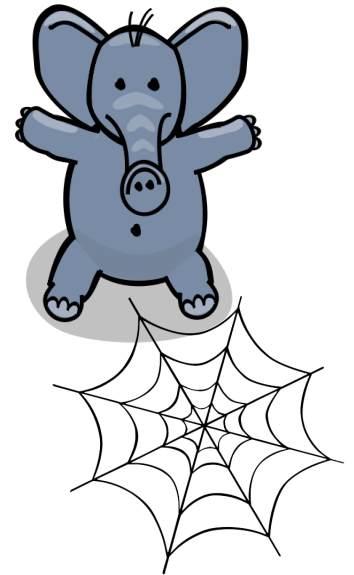
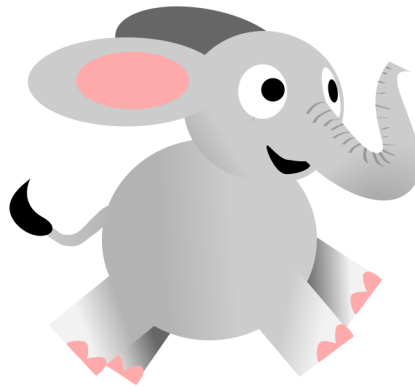
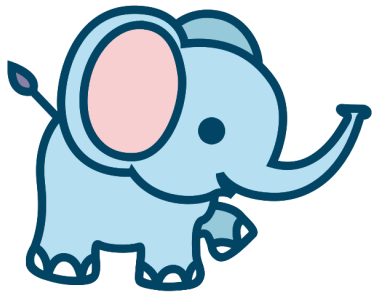
The Elephant

One Elephant Went Out to Play

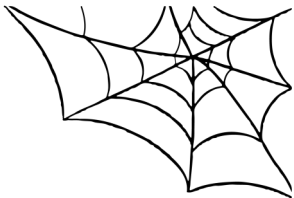
One elephant went out to play upon a spider's web one day.

They had such enormous fun, but the web it broke and they all fell down!

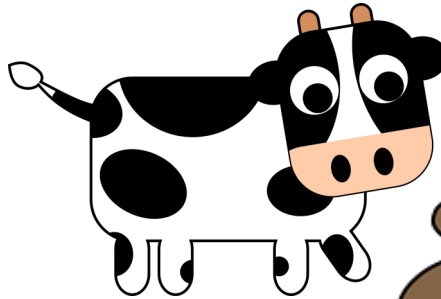

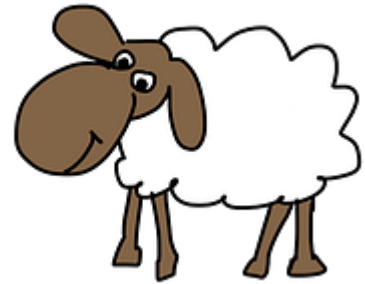
Miss Karen's got a pig on her head

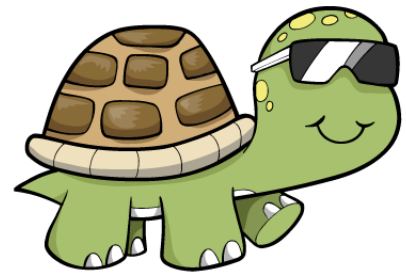

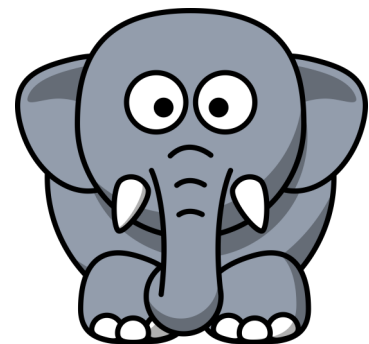

The driver on the bus says, "Move on back..."

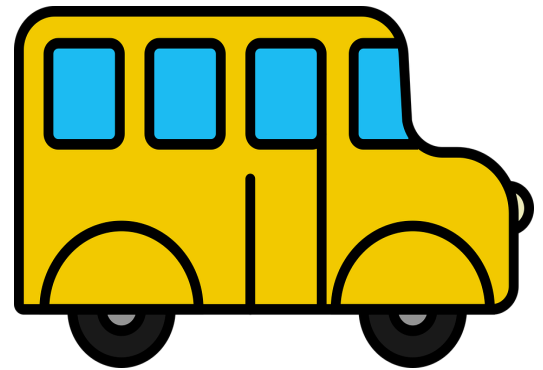
The horn on the bus goes beep, beep, beep...
