Until at last they touch the ground.


The Leaves Are Falling Down

Then you and I shall gather them all!


Ten Ripe Apples

One's named Jack, and one's named Jill.


Fly away, Jack! Fly away, Jill!

Come back, Jack! Come back, Jill!




