And we'll look, look, look. [put on glasses and look from side to side]

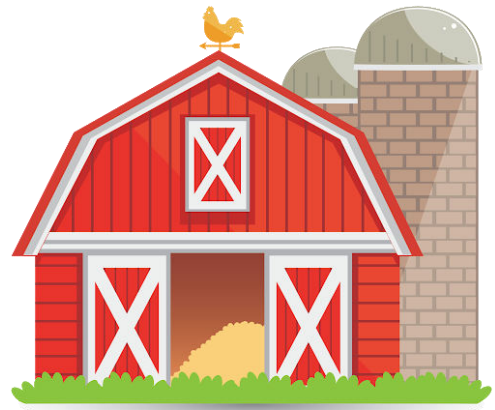
Then we'll put down our glasses, [take off glasses]

And [clap!] close up the book! [close the book]

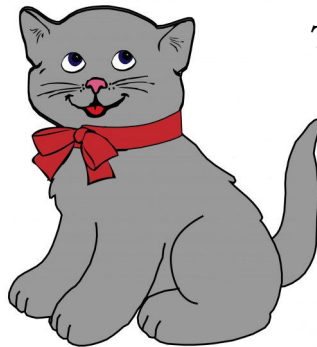


Old MacDonald

In the bright sunlight!

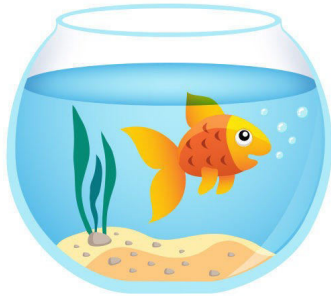
Ten Little Dogs Went Out One Day – rhyme from Kidsparkz

Jig jog jig jog jig a jog gee



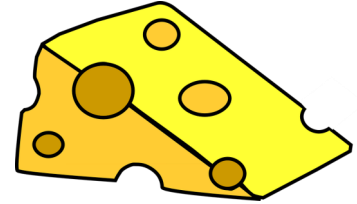
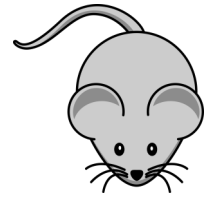
I love to pretend I’m riding a pony

Jig jog jig jog jig a jog gee





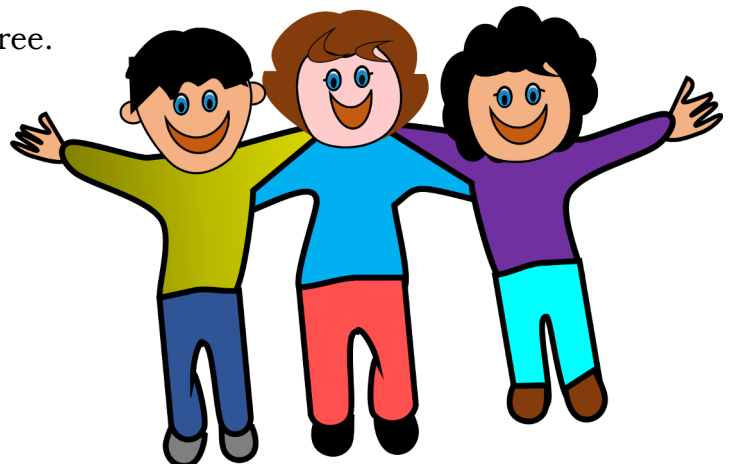
The Farmer in the Dell

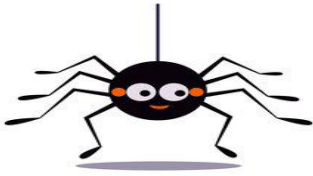
The farmer in the dell, the farmer in the dell,

Deedoodle-ee doodle-ee doodle-ee doo!



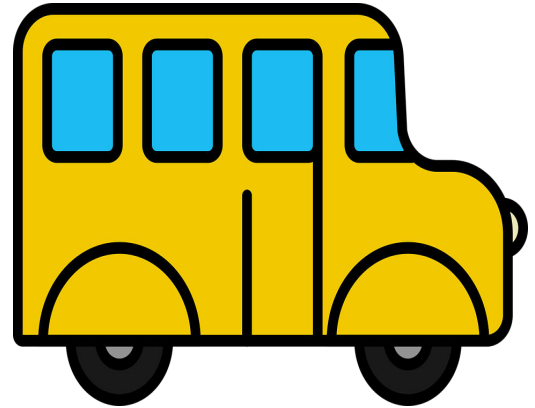


The Itsy-Bitsy Spider
